



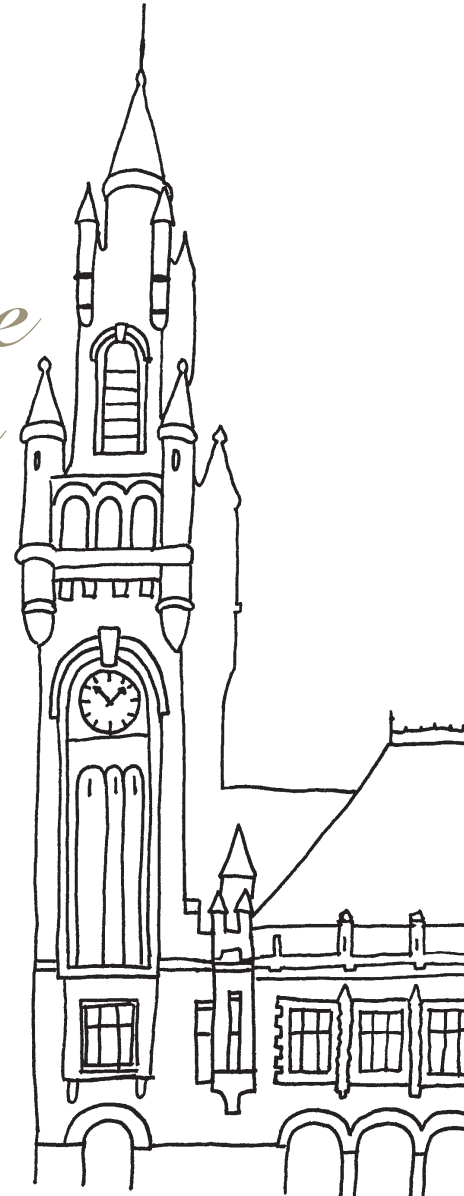

2nd September 2013

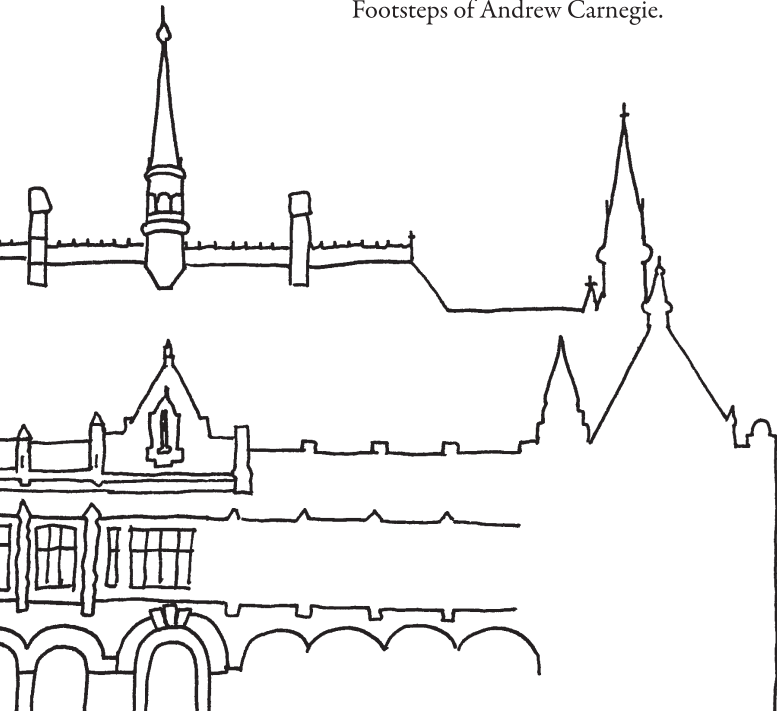
